### **About the Cover Picture**

Memorial Day began in the years immediately following the Civil War-or The War Between the States. Ladies would decorate the graves of their respective loved ones in communities in The South and The North. In several towns the ladies would decorate graves from "the other side". Over time this became a widespread custom. "Memorial Day" came as a result.

The poppy became a symbol of remembrance for World War I veterans after Canadian soldier and physician Major John McCrae wrote the poem "In Flanders Fields" in 1915. The poem describes poppies growing among soldiers' graves along the Western Front, which were often churned up by fighting and shelling. The red poppies came to symbolize the blood shed in battle. In time, this flower came to represent a way to honor all who had died in a nation's battle. Today, we can remember those whose sacrifice made our lives today possible.
